

# Fact Sheet: Overview of Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan applications in ADMS

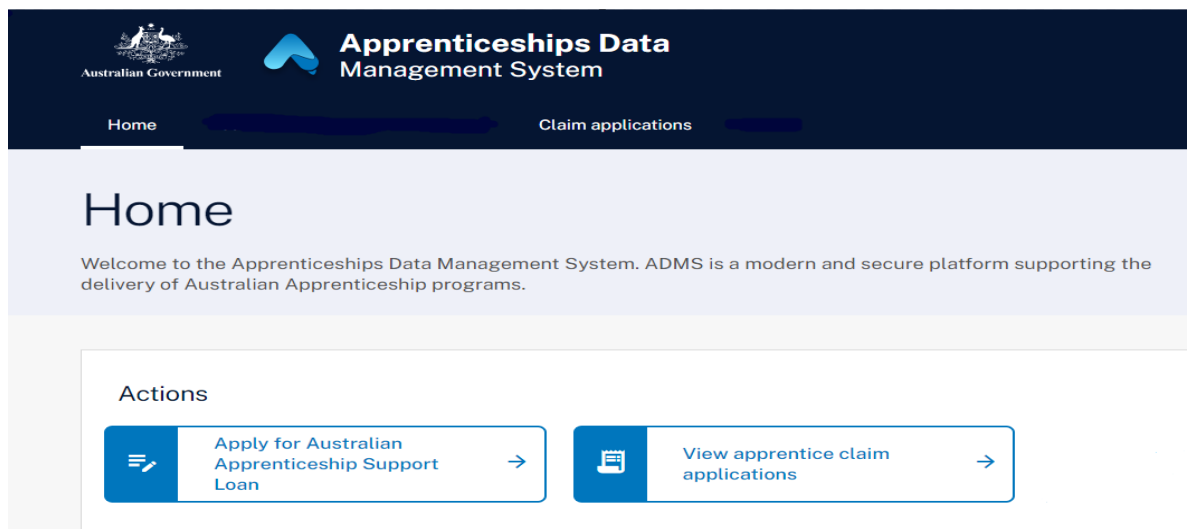
This fact sheet introduces the components and process for Australian Apprentices completing Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan applications in ADMS. Use this fact sheet along with the other ADMS help and support resources to submit loan applications.

## ADMS Home Screen

To begin your application for an Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan, you will first need to [log into ADMS](#).

After you have logged into ADMS, you will see the ADMS home page. Click the 'Apply for Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan' button in the Actions section to begin your application.



## Apprentice Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan application

Clicking on the 'Apply for Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan' will open a page which will provide background information about Australian Apprenticeship Support Loans. Before clicking 'Next' at the bottom of the page, make sure you carefully read the information provided. Once you have clicked 'Next', your Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan application will open. When completing your application, you will need to add information and evidence to support your application before submitting.

The Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan application contains the following sections:

## Apprentice details

The Apprentice details section displays your name and key contact information.

## Tax file number

The tax file number section allows you to add or edit your tax file number (TFN). As repayments of your loan are made through the tax system, ADMS will attempt to verify your TFN with the Australian Tax Office. If your TFN is unable to be verified, check that you entered the correct TFN and that your details are up to date with the ATO.

You can still submit your application with an unverified TFN, but your application won't be approved until it is verified. Your Australian Apprenticeship Support Network (AASN) provider will contact you to discuss when this is the case.

Tax file number
You must <a href="#">add</a> a tax file number (TFN) in order to submit your application.
Your TFN must be verified with the Australian Tax Office as repayments of your loan are made through the tax system.

The Apprenticeship details section displays your apprenticeship qualification and commencement details.

## Apprentice declaration

The Apprentice declaration section is where you will need to declare that you checked all information on the application is accurate and that you understand providing false information is a serious offence.

## Submitting your Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan application

Once you have completed all sections of the Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan application, you are ready to submit for processing.

Apprentice declaration

I declare that:

- I have read and understood the information provided in this application.
- To the best of my knowledge, the details entered in this application are true and correct.

**I acknowledge and accept that:**

- If my application is successful, I will receive up to six Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan payments.**
- I am required to repay the amount borrowed through the Australian Apprenticeship Support Loans program, plus any indexation, when my income reaches or exceeds the minimum repayment income threshold.
- I am responsible for requesting further Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan payments if needed.**
- I am responsible for seeking to cancel Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan payments as needed.
- I must notify my Apprenticeship Network Provider of**
  - any changes to my contact details;**
  - any changes to my circumstances** which could affect my eligibility to receive Australian Apprenticeship Support Loan payments.
- Where I fail to update my details, I may incur a debt that need to repay immediately.
- Intentionally giving false or misleading information is a serious offence.
