If you are a community group or individual with ideas for skills and employment solutions or your business has workforce needs, the Local Jobs program can work with you to develop solutions for your region.

The program is delivered in 51 Employment Regions across Australia.

You can:

- 1. Get support from a locally based Job Coordinator
- 2. Get involved in local initiatives
- 3. Connect with the Local Jobs and Skills Taskforce.



About the Local Jobs Program

In each region, the Local Jobs Program includes:



A <u>Job Coordinator</u> who brings together businesses, employment and skills services and community organisations to connect people to training, jobs and support services.



A <u>Local Jobs and Skills Taskforce</u> that works together to develop local workforce solutions to help people get a job and meet employer needs.



A <u>Local Jobs Plan</u>, which outlines employment priorities and actions.



A Local Initiatives Fund to support small employment activities and community initiatives.



The <u>Local Jobs</u>, <u>Local People Grant</u> funds activities that help people into ongoing employment or training.

Connect you with programs, services, funding opportunities and resources in your local area.



Provide advice to help businesses get the most out of hiring practices to attract and retain the right staff.
