

#### Dear Murray

I write regarding your proposed appointment of Mr Anthony Maher as Chair of Safe Work Australia following the conclusion of Ms Joanne Farrell's term.

I must express my significant concerns regarding Mr Maher's suitability for this role. His long history as the General President of the Mining and Energy Union raises legitimate apprehensions about his capacity to act impartially and prioritise the broad interests of Safe Work Australia over the narrower agenda of a union-aligned perspective.

The Chair of Safe Work Australia should and must exhibit impartiality, independence, and the ability to balance diverse stakeholder interests, including employers, employees, and regulators. Mr Maher's longstanding union leadership raises concerns about the potential for politicisation of this position. The chairmanship demands a leader who can approach issues objectively and ensure that Safe Work Australia operates without undue influence from any single interest group. Appointing an individual so closely identified with union advocacy risks undermining confidence in the impartiality of Safe Work Australia's leadership and its ability to make balanced decisions in the national interest.

Ms Farrell's tenure exemplified the qualities required in this position: independence, strategic vision, and a commitment to fostering consensus across the diverse stakeholders of Australia's work health and safety framework. I urge you to ensure her successor embodies similar qualities and is free from affiliations that could cast doubt on their impartiality.

While I recognise Mr Maher's contributions to mine safety, I strongly recommend that you and the Australian Government consider a candidate with demonstrated independence and a broader perspective on workplace safety across various industries. Such an appointment would better reflect the principles of fairness, impartiality, and inclusivity that are essential to maintaining Safe Work Australia's credibility and effectiveness.





#### **New Chair for Safe Work Australia**

Coal mining industry leader Mr Tony Maher has been appointed as the new Chair of Safe Work Australia.

Mr Maher brings a wealth of experience to the role. He previously served for four years as the Director of Coal Services Pty Ltd - a specialised health and safety scheme that provides services to help identify, assess, monitor and control risks in the coal industry. Mr Maher was a member of the Mine Safety Advisory Council, a NSW Government tripartite advisory body on mine safety between 2002 and 2005. He has also been the General President of the Mining and Energy Union since 1998, which strongly advocates for mine worker safety.

He takes over from Ms Joanne Farrell who departs the role having served as Chair since 2022.

Minister for Employment and Workplace Relations, Murray Watt welcomed the appointment of Mr Maher and thanked Ms Farrell for her service.

"Mr Maher brings immense experience to the role and I'm sure he will build on the significant contribution Ms Farrell made to the agency," Minister Watt said.

"Australian workers have a right to safe and healthy workplaces, and I know Mr Maher will work enthusiastically with employers and workers in his new role.

"Under Ms Farrell's leadership over the past three years, there is now increased awareness of risks to the work health and safety of their workers, including in relation to silicosis.

"The finalisation of the new national strategy to reduce workplace fatalities, injuries and illnesses in Australia is a testament to her work. I would like to thank Ms Farrell for her contribution."

Mr Maher begins in the role from tomorrow on a three-year term.


From 2001 to 2005, Tony Maher served as the Director of Coal Services Pty Ltd, a specialised health and safety scheme that provides an integrated suite of services to help identify, assess, monitor and control risks in the coal industry.

He was a member of the Mine Safety Advisory Council, a tripartite advisory body to the NSW Government on mine safety from 2002 to 2005.

Since 1998, Mr Maher has also been the General President of the Mining and Energy Union, which strongly advocates for mine worker safety and routinely engages with the Commonwealth and state governments on mine safety legislation, standards and codes of practice.

Mr Maher holds a Bachelor of Commerce from the University of New South Wales.

Construction, Forestry, Mining & Energy Union v BHP Steel (AIS) Pty Ltd [2001] FCA 1758 (12 December 2001)  On appeal to the full Federal Court, the CFMEU was held to have been in contempt of a court order by continuing strike action against BHP Steel over coal prices. In the original decision, Justice Kiefel found that the nominee did not do enough in his capacity as General President of the Mining Division when telling NSW CFMEU members to stop their strike action and that this authorised further strike action. Kiefel J held that this was in contempt of the Court order. She also stated that the nominee was not a witness of credit in his recollection of when he was notified of the court order for CFMEU members to stop strike action.  In the appeal Justices Lee and Finn held that there was insufficient evidence that the nominee acting in his professional capacity had authorised the NSW miners to continue strike action, in contempt of the court order. ## **Key Points:**

- 3. On 25 October 2024, your office advised that you wish to appoint Mr Maher as the new Chair of Safe Work Australia following the expiry of Ms Farrell's term on 31 January 2025.
- 4. Mr Maher is the General President of the Mining and Energy Union. Mr Maher has held this position since 1998. From 2001 to 2005, Mr Maher was the Director of Coal Services Pty Ltd, which is a specialised health and safety scheme that provides an integrated suite of services to help identify, assess, monitor and control risks in the coal industry. Mr Maher was also a member of the Mine Safety Advisory Council from 2002 to 2005, which is a tripartite advisory body to the NSW Government on mine safety.
- There are no legislative requirements that you must be satisfied of before appointing Mr Maher, except that you must consult with the WHS Ministers on your proposed appointment before you can make the appointment.
- The Department of Employment and Workplace Relations has conducted due diligence checks on Mr Maher (<u>Attachment D</u>). The results do not suggest that Mr Maher is unsuitable for appointment.

#### **Public Sensitivities:**

7. Stakeholders may question Mr Maher's impartiality in the Chair position given his current role as General President of the Mining and Energy Union and long history of union involvement. His appointment may be seen to affect the current balance of 2 members representing the interests of workers and 2 members representing the interests of employers on Safe Work Australia.

- 9. Subsection 11(2) provides that you must consult with the WHS Ministers about your proposed appointee before you can make the appointment.
- 10. The letters at <u>Attachment A</u> to the WHS Ministers ask that they write to you by 9 January 2025 if they have any serious concerns regarding Mr Maher's appointment.
- 11. The draft letter to the Prime Minister at <u>Attachment B</u> advises that you are consulting with the WHS Ministers and that you will advise him by mid-January 2025 if the WHS Ministers raise any concerns that suggest Mr Maher should not be appointed.

## Legal advice / Legislative impacts:

## Financial impacts:

13. Safe Work Australia is jointly funded by the Commonwealth, state and territory governments through the Intergovernmental Agreement for Regulatory and Operational Reform in Occupational Health and Safety. The Commonwealth funds 50% of the budget with states and territories contributing the remaining 50% proportional to the population of each.

## Gender diversity targets:

- 14. The Australian Government is committed to a gender diversity target of women holding 50% of Australian Government Board positions overall, with at least 40% representation of women and 40% representation of men on individual boards.
- 15. The gender balance of reportable positions for Safe Work Australia is 62% women (8 of 13) and 38% men (5 of 13) and does not meet the gender diversity target. The gender balance of all positions (reportable and non-reportable) is 67% women (10 of 15) and 33% men (5 of 15).
- 16. If the proposed appointment is made it will result in a reportable gender balance for Safe Work Australia of 54% women (7 of 13) and 46% men (6 of 13) and will meet the gender diversity target. The gender balance of all positions (reportable and non-reportable) will be 60% women (9 of 15) and 40% men (6 of 15).

### Remuneration:

17. The Chair of Safe Work Australia is remunerated in accordance with the Remuneration Tribunal (Remuneration and Allowances for Holders of Part-time Public Office) Determination 2024 and is entitled to \$67,460 per annum. The Chair is also entitled to Tier 2 travel expenses in accordance with the Remuneration Tribunal (Official Travel) Determination 2024.

### Background:

- 18. The Cabinet Handbook (15th Edition) provides that short-term acting appointments of up to 3 months may be made without seeking the approval of the Prime Minister or, at his discretion, Cabinet. However, appointments cannot be further extended without the approval of the Prime Minister.
- 19. If the Prime Minister or Cabinet is unable to consider Mr Maher's appointment prior to Ms Farrell's term expiring, and subject to the WHS Ministers raising any serious concerns in relation to the proposed appointment within the period specified, the department will brief you with an instrument to appoint Mr Maher for a term of 3 months.
- 20. Safe Work Australia is the national policy setting body for matters relating to work health and safety and workers compensation. It consists of 14 voting members (the Chair, one member representing the Commonwealth, 8 members each representing a different state or territory, 2 members representing the interests of workers in Australia and 2 members representing the interests of employers in Australia). The Chief Executive Officer of Safe Work Australia is a non-voting member.
- 21. Voting members hold office on a part-time basis for up to 3 years and may be reappointed. There is no statutory limit on the number of terms a member can serve.

## Communications and media strategy:

- 22. On 8 January 2024, the Prime Minister's office advised of a new process relating to public announcements of statutory appointments. Before any public announcement, your office must provide a draft copy of any media release to the Prime Minister's Press Office, along with a completed 'Appointments announcement checklist'.
- 23. A media release and talking points in relation to the inaugural appointments will be provided to your office by the department's Media team, should your office indicate that these are needed. The department will also provide a completed 'Appointments Announcement Checklist' at that time.

#### Stakeholder Implications:

24. Safe Work Australia's Secretariat has advised that the first meeting of 2025 will also be a strategic planning meeting and is currently scheduled for 6 March 2025. It is important that the Chair of Safe Work Australia is appointed prior to the first meeting of 2025 so that they are able to prepare for and participate in the meeting.

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

- 4. On 10 December 2024, you wrote to the Prime Minister, the Hon Anthony Albanese MP, seeking for him to approve or raise for consideration by Cabinet your proposal to appoint Mr Maher for a term of 3 years (MS24-000947 refers).

14. If the proposed appointment is made it will result in a reportable gender balance for Safe Work Australia of 45% women (5 of 11) and 55% men (6 of 11) and will meet the gender diversity target. The gender balance of all positions (reportable and non-reportable) will be 54% women (7 of 13) and 46% men (6 of 13).

#### Remuneration:

15. The Chair of Safe Work Australia is remunerated in accordance with the Remuneration Tribunal (Remuneration and Allowances for Holders of Part-time Public Office) Determination 2024 and is entitled to \$67,460 per annum. The Chair is also entitled to Tier 2 travel expenses in accordance with the Remuneration Tribunal (Official Travel) Determination 2024.

## Background:

- 16. Safe Work Australia is the national policy-setting body for matters relating to work health and safety and workers compensation. It consists of 14 voting members (the Chair, one member representing the Commonwealth, 8 members each representing a different state or territory, 2 members representing the interests of workers in Australia, and 2 members representing the interests of employers in Australia). The Chief Executive Officer of Safe Work Australia is a non-voting member.
- 17. Voting members hold office on a part-time basis for up to 3 years and may be reappointed. There is no statutory limit on the number of terms a member can serve.

#### Communications and media strategy:

- 18. The Prime Minister's office has advised of a new process relating to public announcements of statutory appointments. Before any public announcement, your office must provide a draft copy of any media release to the Prime Minister's Press Office, along with a completed 'Appointments Announcement Checklist'.
- 19. A media release and talking points in relation to the appointment will be provided to your office by the Department of Employment and Workplace Relation's Media team, should your office indicate that these are needed.
  - The department will also provide a completed 'Appointments Announcement Checklist' at that time.

#### Stakeholder Implications:

20. Safe Work Australia's Secretariat has advised that the first meeting of 2025 will be a strategic planning meeting and is currently scheduled for 6 March 2025. It is important that the Chair of Safe Work Australia is appointed prior to the first meeting of 2025 so that they are able to prepare for and participate in the meeting.

"Mr Maher brings immense experience to the role and I'm sure he will build on the significant contribution Ms Farrell made to the agency," Minister Watt said.

"Australian workers have a right to safe and healthy workplaces, and I know Mr Maher will work enthusiastically with employers and workers in his new role.

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Mr Maher begins in the role from tomorrow on a three-year term.



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

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
