Skills for Education and Employment Program

The Skills for Education and Employment (SEE) Program provides free foundation skills training for all Australians aged 15 years and over seeking to improve their reading, writing, maths, English language and digital skills, enabling them to actively participate in the economy and society.

The SEE Program offers both accredited and non-accredited training, provides support for learners and includes workplace training options.

Who is eligible for the SEE Program

To be eligible for the SEE program, people need to be:

- **Either**
 - an Australian citizen **or**
 - a permanent visa holder **or**
 - on a provisional or temporary visa with working rights and eligible for the Adult Migrant English Program **or**
 - a Pacific Australian Labour Mobility visa holder.
- **And**
 - be aged 15 years and over and left school, **and**
 - need help with their reading, writing, maths, English language or digital skills.

How is the SEE Program delivered?

The SEE Program is delivered by a national network of training providers.

The training is flexible and can be:

- full-time or part-time, anywhere in Australia
- delivered in the classroom, in the workplace or online.

What about SEE in the Workplace?

The SEE Program supports opportunities for employers to partner with a SEE Provider to deliver workplace-based training to employed people. This flexible training is tailored to meet the specific needs of your business and can be delivered directly to your employees in the workplace at a time convenient to you.

For industry associations and unions, the SEE Program can also support opportunities for you to partner with a SEE Provider on behalf of your members to design workplace training to suits their needs.

By participating in the SEE Program, employed Australians and their workplaces can benefit from improved verbal and written communication skills and enhanced numeracy and digital skills. This can lead to increased knowledge and confidence which may lead to reduced staff turnover.
